
### NIH- and NSF-funded researchers to begin training in responsible conduct of research

The Office of Research Compliance and Ethics will begin offering training this fall in responsible conduct of research (RCR) for researchers funded by the National Institutes of Health and the National Science Foundation.

The two-part training process requires completion of an online segment followed by a face-to-face lecture component. The online portion is available now through the Research Compliance training web page, <a href="http://www.ncat.edu/~divofres/compliance/irb/training.php">http://www.ncat.edu/~divofres/compliance/irb/training.php</a>.

Researchers who have proposals pending with NIH or NSF will be notified this month to begin the online training and to register for one of the two September opportunities for the face-to-face portion, which will be held Thursday September 9 and Thursday September 23. Both sessions will be held from noon to 1 p.m. in the Fort IRC, Room 410. PIs will be required to successfully complete both parts before a Banner account will be created for an award.

NSF now requires RCR training for undergraduate students, graduate students, and post-doctoral researchers participating on NSF-funded research projects. NIH already required training for fellows, participants, and scholars



Principal investigators must also complete RCR training and will provide oversight to ensure that all participants are in compliance.

#### A reminder from the Office of Sponsored Programs: Don't wait until the last minute (or hour ... or day)

The staff of the Office of Sponsored Programs (OSP) are masters of the complex online systems used for proposal submissions. But one thing they can't make those systems do is turn back the clock.

When a funding agency specifies a deadline, there is no give in the system. If it says 5 p.m. on the 31st, it means 5 p.m. on the 31st, and after that you're out of luck.

To allow time for OSP to review and submit the proposal, don't think in terms of minutes or even hours before the deadline, think in terms of days.

"Two to three days are a minimum to give us the time we need to review the proposal against the solicitation requirements," says Fran Lackey, director of sponsored programs. "We'd like two weeks, but we know that isn't always possible with the workload that PIs have."

OSP can provide a valuable review of the completeness of the proposal and its accuracy in meeting the requirements — critical details that researchers can easily lose

track of in the course of developing a complex proposal. The OSP staff won't review the subject matter of the proposal — that's the PI's domain, Lackey says.

#### IRB handbook for PIs, other online assistance coming soon

The Office of Research Compliance and Ethics is adding three new online aids to help researchers with IRB submissions.

An online PI Handbook provides information on what researchers need to know when submitting IRB applications and what the IRB looks for, based on the specific study procedures being proposed.

In addition to that process information, an IRB policy guide is also being put online.

Step-by-step information on filling out the IRB form will be added to the online IRB application as well. A voice-over will provide audio information on each step in the

application. The information also will be provided in text when users move the mouse over specific questions in the form.

The handbook, policy guide and improved application form are expected to be the Office of Research compliance website by the end of August.

Donna Eaton, IRB compliance officer, says the intent is to out online information that was primarily available through face-to-face meetings. The online approach should be a more efficient way for researchers to receive the information. # Animal-use application form is going electronic; training for PIs to be scheduled this month

A new electronic application form will be rolled out in September for all faculty and students using animals in research. The Animal Care Application (ACAP) will be filled out by researchers and will be accessible by the Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee (IACUC) and the Office of Research Compliance.

Training sessions will be set up during August by the Office of Research Compliance. Information on times, dates and locations will be emailed to researchers and deans. It also will be distributed through the DORED website and other campus media.

The new application system will be substantially different from the old, fill-in-

the-blanks PDF form, says Dr. Tonya Hargett, compliance officer for animal care issues. ACAP will accommodate more information and will interface with RAMSeS.

Any faculty or students using vertebrate animals in research, teaching or demonstrations should apply to the IACUC for approval in advance. Not all such uses will require IACUC approval, but the only way to be sure you're in compliance is to check, Dr. Hargett says.
